October 7, 2021 - Depart for Québec City

Today, you board your international flight for **Québec City, Canada!** On arrival, you'll be met and assisted with your hotel check-in. This evening enjoy a special **Welcome Dinner** to celebrate your first day in Canada!

October 8, 2021 - Discover Québec City

This morning, set out on a **city tour of Québec City!** Nearly five centuries of European presence have left Québec with a priceless heritage that today has been brought vividly to life by numerous interesting sites. From those that showcase the colony's military past to those that evoke the day-to-day life of Québec citizens, you'll find this charming city captivating! Stroll to nearby Old Québec, designated a World Heritage treasure. Packed with museums, mansard-roofed houses and cobblestone streets, it's begging to be explored! This afternoon, you'll be assisted with your transfer to your floating hotel for the next 7 nights, the **Norwegian Gem**. Your ship sails at **4pm**. (B/L/D)

October 9, 2021 - At Sea

Enjoy your day sailing along the Saint Lawrence River, one of the world's great river systems! Today is yours to enjoy aboard the Norwegian Gem. Relax by the pool, get lucky in the casino or unwind at the spa. Hungry? Try Norwegian's signature French restaurant featuring Mediterranean, nouveau and classic French cuisine, Le Bistro. Perhaps Cagney's, an American-style steakhouse where you select from premium choice cuts of Angus beef. However you choose to spend your day - and evening - you'll find the relaxed atmosphere of Freestyle Cruising the perfect way to leave your worries behind! (B/L/D)

October 10, 2021 - Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island

You'll dock in **Charlottetown** at **1pm**. The city strikes a perfect balance, pairing small town charm with big city energy. With its romantic

streetscapes, stunning water vistas and sun-dappled patios, this enchanting coastal city offers a welcome escape from the hustle and bustle. Charlottetown brims with history and artistry. Built for exploring on foot, the area is filled with a colorful mix of independent shops, restaurants, elegantly restored heritage buildings and lush green spaces. Take a pause during your stroll to marvel at the public monuments that pay homage to the city's proud history and unique role as the Birthplace of Confederation. Your ship sails at **8pm**. (B/L/D)

October 11, 2021 - Sydney, Nova Scotia

You'll arrive in **Sydney**, on **Cape Breton Island** this morning at **9am**. The heart of Sydney is its waterfront, a great place to go for a walk, stop to watch a busker and enjoy the view! Along the way, be sure to get your photo taken beside the world's largest fiddle, built in recognition of Cape Breton's musical talent. Nearby, the quaint village of **Baddeck** is home to the Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site honoring the inventor of the telephone - a must see! The **Fortress of Louisbourg** founded by the French in 1713 offers a wealth of experience. With massive stone walls that make it one of the most extensive fortifications in North America, it's been meticulously restored just as it was back in the 1740s. The Gem sails from Sydney at **5pm**. (B/L/D)

October 12, 2021 - Halifax, Nova Scotia

You'll dock in **Halifax** this morning at **8am**. A popular excursion is always **Peggy's Cove**, founded in 1811 by six families of German descent. This quaint fishing village is a photographers delight. Its **classic red and white lighthouse** is one of the most recognizable in the world. After snapping that perfect picture, be sure to visit some of the small, locally owned gift stores, galleries and craft shops. Featuring Canadian and Nova Scotian artists and craftspeople, you'll find charming gifts for friends and family. In **Halifax**, there's so much to see! Perched on a hill high above the city is the **Citadel National Historic Site**. The distinctive star shape is typical of many 19th century, British built forts. It's easy to see why no enemy force dared to attack the Halifax

Citadel. Today, its role is as a reminder of Halifax's past and not as a military fortification. An excursion to **Fairview Cemetery**, best known as the final resting place of 120 victims of the **Titanic** is popular as well. With so much to see, keep an eye on the clock and be sure to return in time for a **5pm** sailing. (B/L/D)

October 13, 2021 - Portland, Maine

Today you'll be in Portland, Maine from **11am** until **8pm**. The thought of Maine may conjure up images of sleepy coastal towns with craggy coastlines, boats blowing in the wind and loads of lobster, but **Portland** is so much more than that, and its charm and ease soothes the soul. Maine's largest city may not seem big to some, but has all the offerings of a vibrant metropolis. The city's dedication to the arts, revered dining scene and incredible preservation and reinvention of its historic Old Port continually impress. Museums abound, kitchens with James Beard Award-winning chefs dot the downtown area and local boutiques share streets with national chains. The **Old Port waterfront** features working fishing wharves and converted warehouses with restaurants and shops. Nearby, the **Western Promenade** is a public park atop a bluff, offering river and mountain views. Its surrounding district, the West End, is full of Victorian-era homes, including the Victoria Mansion museum. You'll also find secluded beaches on island shorelines,

centuries-old lighthouses perfectly positioned on coastal bluffs - and those **mouthwatering lobster rolls!** (B/L/D)

October 14, 2021 - Bar Harbor, Maine

Bar Harbor, Maine is known for its stunning coastal beauty, lobster boats and spectacular views. You'll be here from **8am** to **5pm** so make the most of your time! Nearby **Acadia National Park** is a gorgeous treasure with views from **Cadillac Mountain** that are never-ending. If Mother Nature cooperates, the 47,000 acres just might be awash in the bright colors of fall! Vice President Nelson Rockefeller was born in Bar Harbor in 1908, and the community has long been a summer retreat for the rich and famous. You won't find a Starbucks or McDonald's here, but you will find quirky shops and cafes sporting names like **Cool as a Moose** and **Carmen Verandah!** It's a great place to stroll, linger and feel the cool breeze of the Atlantic - and perhaps enjoy a **blueberry beer** and some of that world-famous **lobster!** (B/L/D)

October 15, 2021 - Boston, Massachusetts

You'll dock in **Boston** this morning at **7am**. Enjoy a relaxing breakfast before disembarking and being assisted with your luggage and airport transfer. Your memories of your **Canada and New England Cruise Tour - highlighting Quebec City** are sure to last a lifetime! (B)
