**February 25, 2020 - Your Journey Begins**

Today, you board your flight bound for **Salt Lake City**. On arrival, start your **Winter Wonderland** experience with a sightseeing tour in this Olympic City! Then check in to your downtown hotel before enjoying a very special **Welcome Dinner** at the historic **Lion House**, built in 1856 as church leader and first Governor Brigham Young's elegant family home, and filled with beautiful antique furnishings!

**February 26, 2020 - From Salt Lake to Yellowstone!**

After breakfast this morning, you'll travel through Utah and Idaho, with lunch on your own along the way, heading for **West Yellowstone** where you'll visit the **Grizzly and Wolf Discovery Center**. Here, you'll have a unique opportunity to learn about, view and appreciate the grizzly bear and gray wolf. Watch these fascinating animals interact in their outdoor habitats. In the Naturalist Cabin, you'll have exceptional views of two separate wolf packs through floor-to-ceiling windows! The wolves are captive-born and possess a dynamic and strong family structure that you'll get to observe. The grizzly bears residing here are animals that are unable to live in the wild, many orphaned and rescued from certain death. They have a second chance here and you'll be fascinated by their antics! You'll also visit the **Yellowstone IMAX Theatre** where you'll be immersed in the breathtaking scenery, majestic wildlife and vivid

sights and sounds of Yellowstone! Check into the Inn with some time to relax before enjoying dinner at a local restaurant.

Overnight: West Yellowstone - Gray Wolf Inn and Suites (B/D)

**February 27, 2020 - Old Faithful in Winter!**

This is your day to discover **Yellowstone National Park**, America's oldest and most famous national park. Travel via private chartered **snowcoaches**, heated for your comfort! Keep those cameras ready, as you'll have clear views of this winter wonderland. Few people get the opportunity to experience this spectacular park at this special time of year, and your experienced Yellowstone guide will share many insights with you as you travel across the snow. Visit some of the landmarks that Yellowstone is so famous for, including **Firehole Falls**, **Fountain Paint Pots** and of course the world's most famous geyser, **Old Faithful!** After lunch on your own and time to watch Old Faithful's dramatic display, you'll journey south through Yellowstone into **Grand Teton National Park**. You'll leave the snowcoach behind to enjoy the spectacular scenery as you head into **Jackson**, where you'll check into the **Rustic Inn Creekside** for a two night stay. Located on twelve acres adjacent to the National Elk Refuge and just a few blocks from Jackson's lively town square, the Rustic Inn is a **destination resort** complete with a revitalizing spa and innovative cuisine. ### February 29, 2020 - Back to Salt Lake City!

After breakfast, you'll leave Jackson this morning to travel through western Wyoming, surrounded by silver streams, soaring peaks and lush meadows. Drive through the rugged **Snake River Canyon**, stopping in pastoral **Starr Valley**. You'll visit Evanston to stretch your legs and have lunch on your own, before continuing to **Utah's Olympic Park** near Park City. Enjoy a guided tour of this amazing facility that was the site of many competitions during the 2002 Winter Olympic Games. Many of the guides here are future and past winter Olympians in training. You'll see the Utah Ski and Olympic Museum, Nordic Jumps and the Bobsled and Luge Track, which has some of the fastest ice around. Then you'll return

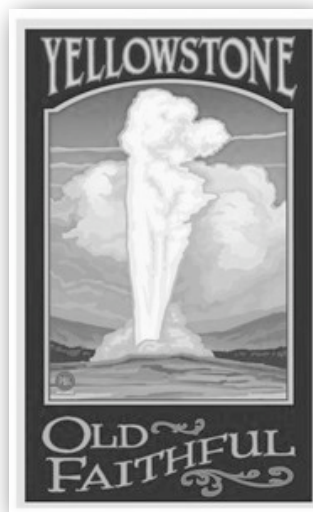
